

We had a great class with very enthusiastic attendees, including a 11 year old! Attendees learned how to properly cut their fabric with a rotary cutter, how to make a French seam, how to properly press their seams as they sewed,



and some even learned how to thread their machines and sew in reverse, in addition to completing their pillowcases! Many thanks to Cindy, Cheryl Wilcox, Rachel Rohrer and Heather Schaller for helping every single attendee to be successful in their creations. Our next Extension office class is planned for July - the topic is twilling by Linda Hagen.


