It is now possible for you to do several tasks online, tasks you would normally have done at our in-person meetings:

January K-State Extension Workshop Presentation

Tuesday, Jan. 26 from 6-8 p.m.

Quilt Blocks – Improvisational Quilting in the Manner of Gee's Bend

Join **Cindy Nice** as she shares with viewers what she learned at a workshop in North Carolina. Cindy will be showing the techniques used by the quilters of Gee's Bend, AL to create quilts made from whatever textiles were available to them.

This is a Zoom presentation. Viewers must have a Zoom account on their computer (free) and **register** with the K-State Extension and Research Center before the event. The workshop is listed under the [Classes and Events](#) title.

Upon registration, on the day of the presentation, you will get a **link to the Zoom meeting** in your email which opens the meeting for you to be a participant. You do not need a camera or microphone built into your computer in order to view and hear Cindy's presentation. This is an opportunity to learn about quilts made in the South during the 19th century.

Two Colors – One Quilt

Hope you join in the fun, in 2021!

The rules are simple: Pick two colors to make your quilt. You may pick two fabrics or if you want a slight scrappy look, use shades of one or both of the two colors that you have picked. It is suggested that you try to stay as close to your two chosen colors as possible so that your quilt is really a two color quilt.

You pick your colors. You pick the pattern. You pick the size. Make it for you, make it as a gift for someone special or for a special occasion, or make it for charity.

Just work to have it completed by the end of the year when we have our wrap up meeting - assuming that we will be able to meet. We will work something out! Prizes will be available.

I have attached a picture of a quilt made by my paternal grandmother. I consider it a two color quilt. The colors are not quite true so hopefully, at a future meeting I can bring it for show and tell. But the dark color is a white print on maroon, with the second color being white, or an off white, maybe due to age?

Wouldn't it be fun to see more two color quilts? If you have one, would you send a picture to be included throughout our future newsletters? If you have a story about the quilt, please share.

Let's have fun in 2021. Easy rules. Don't know about you, but I bet one of my colors will be blue.

02 FOUR X by Jo Morton

MATERIALS

The featured block uses 1 light, 1 dark,
and 2 medium prints.

- A: 2 squares, $2\frac{1}{4}'' \times 2\frac{1}{4}''$, of light print
- B: 2 squares, $2\frac{1}{4}'' \times 2\frac{1}{4}''$, of medium print #1
- C: 2 squares, $3\frac{1}{4}'' \times 3\frac{1}{4}''$, of light print
- D: 2 squares, $3\frac{1}{4}'' \times 3\frac{1}{4}''$, of dark print
- E: 1 square, $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, of medium print #2

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

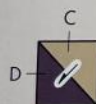
Press all seam allowances in the directions
indicated by the arrows.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each A square. Place a marked square right sides together with a B square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ from both sides of the drawn line. Cut the unit apart on the marked line to make two half-square-triangle units. Make four units that measure $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square, including seam allowances.



Make 4 units,
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

2. Repeat step 1 using the C and D squares to make four units that measure $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square, including seam allowances.



Make 4 units,
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

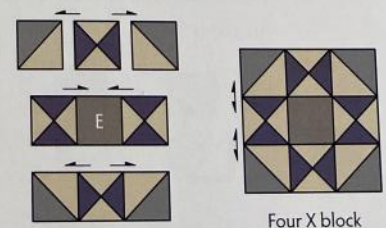


3. On the wrong side of two C/D units, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner, perpendicular to the seamline. Layer a marked unit on an unmarked C/D unit, right sides together with the dark triangles on top of the light triangles. Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ from both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the line to yield two hourglass units. Make four units that measure $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square, including seam allowances.



Make 4 units,
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

4. Lay out the A/B units, hourglass units, and E square in three rows, rotating the units as shown. Sew the units and square together into rows. Join the rows to make a block that measures $6\frac{1}{2}''$ square including seam allowances.

KCRQF Update

KCRQF (Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival)

PRE-ORDERING MERCHANDISE

You should have received an email in December with information on how to pre-order your festival ticket(s), t-shirt or other merchandise—if you did not receive it, please contact Heather Buchwitz or Jenny Boudreaux.

SHOWCASE YOUR QUILT

Thinking positively, the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival (KCRQF) will be held June 17 – 19! As in the past, we have the opportunity to display our talents. It is now time to think about displaying your quilt. Quilt sizes must range between 24 inches square up to 92 x 96 inches. To accommodate as many members as possible, we request you consider a smaller size quilt for display. Each quilt must have been made between 2019 – 2021 and must have a four-inch rod pocket for hanging.

Although the two videos are not completely clear, it is important that when cutting your rod pocket, cut the fabric 8 1/2" by the width of your quilt.

In accurately measuring your quilt at home it is simply length by width. Remember not to go by what the pattern states when completing your form as that may not be your completed size. If anyone needs assistance with measuring, please call Kathleen Manning or Janice Meloan.

The February newsletter will include an application form. Complete this form by the end of February. The entry form and a picture of your quilt must be emailed to Kathleen Manning. Note – When you send in your form and picture please know that the quilt does not have to be completed to submit it for possible showing. However, all quilts turned in during the June guild meeting must be quilted, bound and have a rod pocket attached.

During our March guild meeting, a random number selection process will take place. The remaining portion of this meeting will be a PowerPoint presentation of quilts submitted as possible displays for the KCRQF.

Please notify Janice or Kathleen if you have any contacts with groups needing community service hours to assist us with hanging the quilts on June 16 and taking them down on June 19, 2021.

In closing, quilts selected through the lottery process in March will be collected at our June 8 guild meeting. Please bring the quilt in a bag that you can see through with your name and phone number on a card inside the bag. You may want to put the name card in a small clear bag so as not to get ink on your quilt. This is an excellent opportunity to showcase the expertise of our guild members!

Meeting Minutes

General Meeting Minutes
Olathe Quilter's Guild
Dec 8, 2020

President Teresa Jones opened the meeting of Olathe Quilter's Guild at 6:30 on the Zoom computer application. 47 people were present according to Karen Genis.

Teresa asked for approval of the secretary's minutes. Cheryl Wilcox made the motion and Sheila Pierce seconded. The motion carried. Janie Benander made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. It was seconded by Lynda Ochs and carried.

Teresa reported on the method of selling tickets by using the Square website. The site is set up and members will be able to make payments to the guild with credit cards. She shared her computer screen so the site was visible and said the link will be sent out. The Quarantine Geometry Quilt will be the first test of the usefulness and ease of understanding of the Square site. Mary Ellen Winter noted that the proceeds from this quilt will benefit the Charity Committee. The link to purchase Hobbs batting has not yet been set up.

Programs: Mary Ellen Winter has plans in the works for the next five months. January's program will be on Batting, by Lyn Heilman of Quilted Memories. Kelly Asher will give a Zoom program in February called "Fussy and Fabulous." May will have Barb Eichmeier. Details to follow.

KCRQF: Heather Buchwitz, Teresa Jones and Mary Ellen Winter modeled T-shirts in different colors and sizes that will be the ones printed for the festival. T-shirts, pins, and bags are listed on a pre-order form sent to members by Jenny Boudreaux. The form includes festival tickets which will be sold online at the reduced guild prices. Some class descriptions now appear on the kcrqf.com website, but without details. Times and prices will be added by January 1 when members of participating guilds may enroll. After February 1st the classes will be offered to the public. (Editor's Note: the new date is Jan 15, not Jan 1.)

Charity: Cindy Nice would like suggestions for which charities members would like to support in 2021. Please contact her with ideas and preferences.

Teresa Jones shared a 15 minute video of making a no-sew Christmas ornament called the Scandinavian Folded Star. It will be posted on the guild Facebook site. A picture was also shown of Mary Ellen's folded star that looks like a fancy bow.

Heather Buchwitz described a workshop offered by the Blue Valley Quilter's Guild to be held January 6, 2021. Linda and Carl Sullivan of Colorwerx, will teach "Conquer Your Fear of Curves," from 10:00 to 4:00 for \$40. It combines strip piecing and the Drunkard's Path pattern to make striped circles. This will also be posted to Facebook.

Show and Tell participants were Mary Ellen Winter, Janice Meloan, Jessie Vandenberg, Rachel Rohrer, Teresa Jones, Joellen Randall and Carol Crane. Photos were shown by Jenny Boudreaux in a Power Point presentation and quilters could describe their work.

The meeting was concluded at 7:30 pm.

Zoom Tips

Downloading the Zoom client

You can download the Zoom Desktop Client for Mac, Windows, ChromeOS and Linux, as well as the Zoom Mobile App for iOS and Android from our Downloads page.

Joining another user's meeting

There are many ways to join a meeting, but the easiest way is to click the join link that the meeting host provided. You can also click **Join** in your Zoom client and enter the meeting ID.



Join

As a guild member, you will receive an email with the Zoom link to join our monthly meeting. At the time of the meeting, you will click on the link to enter a Zoom meeting room. You click the “Join” button pictured above. Please make sure your name is entered into your profile. Then meeting host will admit you to the meeting.

The guild asks that everyone keep their microphone on **Mute** so we can hear the presenters and speakers.

Here are a few more tips to remember:

- If you keep your camera on, remember we can see everything you do and everything happening behind you.
- In the bottom center of the screen is a “Chat” feature. You can send messages to the whole group or private messages to individuals.
- If you have a question for the speaker, please put it in the “Chat”.
- If you invite a guest, please let Karen Genis know, so she can let the guest into our Zoom meeting (since she is the host, she can admit people to our Zoom meeting even if they are not a guild member).
