# Coming Up Next

## Scandinavian Fold Star – no sew ornament

Our next guild meeting will be held **via Zoom on Tuesday Dec. 8 beginning at 6:30pm** (a meeting link will be emailed out prior to the meeting). I will be demonstrating this ornament during the meeting. If you would like to make the ornament with me, please have the following items available before the meeting starts.

### Supplies:

Four (4) rectangles measuring about 3" x 14"

Clover Wonder Clip or Binder Clip

Tweezer or Bodkin

Scissors

Needle and embroidery thread (if you want to hang the star)

### Preparation:

For each piece of fabric:

1. Press in half lengthwise – creating a center fold
2. Open fabric then fold raw edges together to meet at the center and press
3. Refold center and press once more
4. Fold strip in half – raw edges together and press.

### Zoom “Show and Tell” Process





# Block of the Month—2020 & 2021

## 2020 Block of the Month

Well ladies, we are at the end of 2020 Block of the Month. We plan to do our reveal at our first in-person meeting in 2021. I thought I'd put this in the newsletter to remind you of our plan/rules for winning a prize. It is a modified row by row: modified because you define how many blocks are in a row, how many rows in your quilt and the size of the blocks. You also decide the 'shape' of your finished project. If you look at Row by Row quilts on Pinterest, there are lots finished in different shapes - i.e. a heart.

All blocks can be pieced - though, if I published a pieced heart and you'd rather do an applique or paper pieced option, it works, as long as it's recognizable as a heart. Each month for 11 months I published 2 blocks - one a standard block and one I'd consider a connector - i.e. a 4 patch which can be used when putting your rows together.

One month I only published 1 block and information about a 'special' block. "Special block – what's that?" you ask. One of the committee members wanted to build her quilt around a special fabric and have that be one of the blocks. So as we discussed further we decided your quilt needs to include 10 of the published blocks and one block of your design. Have you wanted to try trapunto, paper piecing, English paper piecing, embroidery or have a special piece of fabric? Well, that's your special block!

At our first in-person meeting in 2021 bring your finished top or quilt. We want to see your project even if it's not quilted. Your project needs to include at least 10 different of the published blocks and your special block. Prizes will be awarded for 1) overall favorite, 2) favorite setting and 3) best incorporation of your special block. Your quilt does not need to be quilted to win a prize.

This has been a different block of the month this year but for me one that has spurred a bit more creativity to come up with a finished product. With life as it became it's been a welcome distraction. I hope you have enjoyed it a bit as well.

We'll have some extra time to finish our projects; enjoy the process, find the joy in creating as we are much more isolated than we enjoy. See you and your quilts in the spring!! **Carolyn Chaffin**

# Guild Meeting Minutes

General Meeting Minutes  
Olathe Quilter's Guild  
November 10, 2020

The first general guild meeting to be held via the Zoom application was opened by President Teresa Jones at 6:30, November 10, 2020. She immediately asked Mary Ellen Winter to introduce the speaker, Diane Harris of Stash Bandits. Ms. Harris presented a virtual trunk show of scrap quilts and encouraged quilters to learn something from each quilt they make.

At 7:35 the business meeting resumed with a motion by Melissa Toburen to approve the minutes of the October 13th outdoor meeting as written in the newsletter. The motion was seconded by Lisa Hirsch and carried. Libby Corriston made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, which was seconded by Karen Lacy and carried.

K-State Extension: Lynda Ochs was videoed to present the first of the four Beginner Quilting Workshops. Libby Corriston reported she did a great job, and 12 people attended virtually on November 5th. The next one will be December 3rd.

KCRQF: Heather Buchwitz is working on producing T-shirt samples for festival merchandise. She said that selling last year's merchandise is probably over due to lack of interest from other guilds.

Charity Committee: Linda Hagen has collected 41 quilts for veterans this year. Mary Pacey said charity work forms may be emailed to her or members can send pictures, what part(s) of the sewing process they did and descriptions of charity quilts they completed and either gave to Cindy Nice or personally donated to a charity instead of having to send a copy of the form.

2021 Officers: Teresa named Melissa Toburen, who has volunteered for the Publications position and Carol Crane has volunteered for Ways & Means Elect. Linda Hagen made a motion to nominate them to the slate. It was seconded by Lisa Hirsch and approved.

Ways & Means: Karen Genis offered Snowman Panels for \$6.00, which should be completed before this Christmas. There are 12 available, with 4 reserved by members at the meeting. The contact for these is Carol Crane.

Announcements: Sheri Keller told the group she will be having shoulder surgery on December 4th.

Show and Tell: Jenny Boudreaux authored a Power Point show of quilts made by herself, Gretchen Ryan, Carol Crane, Ava Wright, Heather Schaller (a new Ainsley 26), Melissa Toburen, Janice Meloan, Teresa Jones and Anna Mae Wagner. Each person had a chance to talk about her quilt(s).

The next guild meeting will be December 8th with a Zoom program by Teresa Jones with ideas for no-sew holiday gifts. The January program will be on batting. The next Board meeting will be next Tuesday, November 17th at 6:30.

Teresa adjourned the meeting at 8:05.
