

Committee Updates

Johnson County Fair—July 28 - August 4

The Johnson County Fair in Gardner is less than two months away! The theme for this year is "Show It, Sew It, Grow It" When the fair board releases the online fair book for the open class exhibits, we will inform you. In the meantime, be thinking of quilts, wall hangings, table runners, etc. you can enter. There are many categories, so whatever you want to enter, we can find a spot for you!

For the last several years there has been a \$5 entry fee. This is a fee for each time you log on to the website to enter, so make sure you are prepared to enter all your quilts at the same time, because it will cost you an additional \$5 the next time you log on. And while you are logged on, why not enter in other classifications? Do you crochet, bake, or take awesome pictures? You may just recoup your \$5 in ribbon money!

We will need many volunteers to help with checking in quilts, scribing for judges, hanging quilts, monitoring the building, and releasing the quilts. There will be sign-up sheets at the June and July guild meetings and also an online Sign-Up Genius. So mark your calendars now for fun at the fair.

Fair Co-Charipersons Conna Hiltner Shelia Pierce

In July, the President's Quilt committee will be checking out kits for the Chandelier Quilt blocks for Rachel's President's Quilt. Traditionally, we ask that each member complete a block for the quilt. Each kit will contain the directions, plus the black fabric you need, already cut for you. We ask that each of you provide a warm colored (red, orange, yellow) batik for the block. You will need one batik piece that is $5" \times 5"$ and two pieces from the same fabric that are each $2\%" \times 2\%"$. One note about the batik color – be sure that your signature will be visible if written in black ink.

Please stop by at the July or August guild meeting to pick up a kit. We ask that you return your completed untrimmed block at our September meeting. When you return the completed block in September, we will have pens for you to sign your block at that time.

May 14, 2024

President Rachel Rohrer called the meeting to order. Thirty five members were present in person, six via Zoom, and there were four visitors.

Linda Hagen, Program Chair, introduced Phyllis Stewart with her presentation on Miniatures and Doll Quilts.

Secretary's Minutes - Karen Lacy made a motion to accept the minutes from the April meeting as printed in the newsletter. Shelia Pierce seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report – Peggy Anderson moved that the treasurer's report as printed in the newsletter be approved. Heather Schaller seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Rachel announced the May birthdays.

Reports from:

Programs Linda Hagen reminded us that next month's meeting is at Penwell-Gable at 143rd and Blackbob Rd in Olathe. The consensus of the group is to have a school house format.

Outreach and Education Jenny Boudreaux reported the pillow case class taught by Cindy Nice at the Extension office was great. Linda Hagen will present Twilling in July. There is also an event at Mahaffie House in July. Melissa Toburen said our quilts were well received at Ensor Fest. There was interest in joining the guild and purchasing quilts. We might want to have quilts, perhaps small items, for sale next year.

Opportunity Quilt Mary Ellen Winter said she and Libby Corriston have the quilt assembled. The paper backings have been removed. She will be taking it to Heather Buchwitz for quilting.

KCRQF Dae Curtiss encouraged members to enter the Showcase Quilt. The theme is "Celebrating Quilting Journeys". Requirements and entry information are at KCRQF.COM under quilts. Entry forms must be received by October 31, 2024. Sherri Critchfield has an idea and is looking for others to form a team to enter together. See her if interested. Our job for the 2025 festival is Volunteers Pre Event. The board will vote in July on how proceeds will be distributed to participating guilds.

President's Quilt Lynda Ochs and Libby showed the block for a Chandelier Quilt made with Batiks in warm colors on black background with maker's signature. The guild will provide the background and pens for signing. There will be more information in the June newsletter. Kits will be distributed in July and will be due back by September.

Johnson County Fair Shelia encouraged members to have entries. Theme and details have not been announced. Runners and miniatures are welcome as well as larger quilts. There will be sign-up sheets later for helping.
