#### **Spotlight Quilter - Karen Goodwin**





Karen Goodwin started quilting about 25 years ago, but did not quilt for several years during that period due to a busy career and family. Karen has been retired for 4 years now and has really enjoyed getting back into quilting and sewing. Karen learned to sew in junior high from her grandmother and Home EC classes. Knowledge of basic sewing techniques, passion for beautiful fabrics, and tendency to give away handmade gifts just naturally led Karen to quilting. Karen's first experience with quilting was a Quilt in a Day class that she took with a friend. Karen is very eclectic in her quilting tastes. She prefers bright colors and simple designs, but enjoys both modern and traditional patterns. Karen machine pieces all the guilts that she makes. She has a longarm quilting machine and does basic pantographs, but considers herself a novice. Karen's fabric stash consists of many kits, scraps, fabrics that she couldn't resist and a few of those impulsive buys that later make her wonder "what was I thinking!" She seems to want to "save" her fabrics/ scraps and sometimes resist cutting into them often resulting in buying more fabric! Karen feels that many quilters have an abundance of fabric because of the vast and vibrant fabric options that bombard us on visual and tactile levels as well as appeal to our creative nature to "make". Karen gives the quilts she makes to friends and family which brings her immense pleasure. She owns her first quilt (Quilt in a Day log cabin) and an I-Spy quilt; otherwise, her quilts have always been given as gifts. The quilting industry has been revolutionized by the never-ending supply of fabrics and designer collections, precuts, timesaving tools and techniques, modern quilting ideas, etc. Karen thinks that the greatest impact, however, has been the internet since it has increased accessibility of information, education, products, and friendship through social media. Karen hopes that her guilts will be her legacy since they are tangible evidence to family and friends of her love. She also hopes that she can teach her daughters, granddaughters or others how to quilt! Karen has been an Olathe Quilters Guild member since 2014. Karen's advice to us is to, "Gather as much information as you can from classes, books, the internet, and friends and then form your own repertoire of what works best for you rather than worrying about rules, dos and don'ts."

November 14, 2017

The November 2017 guild meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by president Shari Pine. The meeting opened with guild members enjoying a delicious holiday meal catered by Hy -Vee organized by Mary Pacey.

Following the dinner, Shari convened the business meeting and introduced Lynda Ochs as the Spotlight Quilter of the month. The minutes and treasurer's report of the October 2017 meeting were both approved as printed in the newsletter.

Committee reports, and related discussions were presented as follows:

 Mary Pacey, VP/Program chair, thanked those who came early to help with set up and dinner.

Next month, there will be an ornament exchange, installation of new officers, committee sign-ups, games and snacks. December meeting attendees are encouraged to bring snacks to share.

Mary stated that changes to the OQG by-laws/procedures will be forthcoming.

- Teresa Jones, VP/Program chair-elect, is continuing to gather unknown facts about guild members in preparation for the January getting to know you activity.
- Shelia Pierce, Membership co-chair, announced that the current guild membership is 70 members.
- Linda Hagen, Ways and Means chair-elect, stated that Mary Rayborn has agreed to cochair Ways and Means with her next year. She added that there will be two buddy baskets in January and encouraged members to share fund-raising ideas for next year.
- Sherri Irving, Charity committee chair, displayed 12 completed quilts that will be donated to Project Warm Embrace for distribution to Johnson County foster children in December. Volunteers for quilting and binding of additional quilts are still needed.
- Karen Lacy shared information about the upcoming Ricky Tims' Luminarium event in March 2018. There will be a drawing involving a \$50 discount for those interested in attending.

In lieu of a formal program, several special presentations were held this evening. Challenge quilt competition results, by vote of the guild, were as follows: first place—Mary Ellen Winter; second place—Gretchen Ryan; third place—Peggy Anderson. The Opportunity quilt raffle drawing was held, and the winner was Mary Ellen Winter. Gretchen Ryan presented the president's quilt to Shari Pine, for her service as the guild president for the past two years. Gretchen also awarded six participants in the UFO challenge with coasters. The UFO challenge winner was Kerri Robinson who will be awarded a set of Amy Bradley notecards. Carolyn Routh won the fabric donation challenge organized by Arlene Banks to benefit the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild who lost a great deal of fabric in the recent wildfires in California.

#### **OQG Minutes cont. from the November 2017 Meeting**



Guild members Barb Fife and Barb Dietz proposed a reduction in the annual guild dues from \$30 to \$20 which led to a discussion of guild finances and prioritizing how extra funds are spent. It was proposed that the board discuss these issues during the November and December board meetings and come back to the guild with voting options in January.

Heather Buchwitz proposed that our guild have a private Facebook group. She will research this and report to the board in January.

In attendance tonight were 48 members. The November door prize winner was Cheryl Wilcox. There were 14 quilters who participated in Show and Tell. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm.

## Quilting Tip ~ Jean Spohrer



Instead of using pins, Elmer's school glue works great to hold your binding down. Prepare and attach binding as usual to the top of your quilt. Press to the backside. Make sure the outer fold of the binding covers stitching by about an eighth of an inch. Press. Place a very small dab of glue and press down. Repeat all the way around the quilt. Sew in the ditch from the topside. With the binding glued down you will be sure to catch the stitching, and it will be uniform. The binding will not be stiff if you use a very small amount; and the glue will wash out.


## For Sale: Handi Quilter Avante 18 Longarm

## Recipe of the Month ~ Cheryl Wilcox



#### GRANDMOTHER EIKENBERRY'S CRANBERRY SALAD

(The tastiest way to eat cranberries Cheryl's ever found!)

Wash and grind one pound of fresh cranberries. (Cheryl finds them easier to grind if they are frozen).

Add 2 cups of sugar, cover and place in refrigerator overnight. (If you use a smaller package of cranberries, cut back on the sugar).

Add to cranberry and sugar mixture:

- 1 cup grapes, seeded and cut up
- 2 cups miniature marshmallows
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup whipped cream (Yes, use REAL whipped cream)

Makes a large salad. (The quilting grandmother was a very good cook too.)


