These **Martha Washington Candies** were very popular at the December meeting. Here's the recipe, in case you didn't get a copy in January.

Ingredients

- 2 sticks (1 cup) butter, melted
- 1 lb powdered sugar
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- 1 14 oz package shredded coconut, sweetened
- 1 14 oz can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 10 oz jar maraschino cherries, drained and chopped
- 3 cups finely chopped pecans
- 1 16 oz package chocolate <u>Candiquik</u>

Instructions

- 1. After chopping cherries, place on a paper towel so the liquid can be absorbed. Blot dry with additional paper towels.
- 2. Combine all ingredients except for Candiquik in a large bowl.
- 3. Refrigerate for at least two hours. Tip #1 the colder the filling is the quicker the chocolate will set up
- 4. Form into balls about the size of a walnut or whatever size you prefer.
- 5. Refrigerate balls for 20 minutes. Tip #2 See tip #1
- 6. Line baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 7. Melt Candiquik according to package directions.
- 8. Dip balls into chocolate, (I <u>use these tools here</u>) tap off excess, and place on lined baking sheet to set up. Tip #3: Get off as much chocolate as you can otherwise it will pool at the bottom of the candy and you'll have to trim it off.
- 9. Repeat until all balls are covered in chocolate.
- 10. Store in airtight container.

Makes about 60 candies.

Ways and Means

The 2019 Ways & Means committee has started planning. We need your scraps. During 2018 we will collect your scraps. But you will have to wait until January 2019 to see what is planned!

Needed: red, white, blue, black, yellow, orange, green and purple fabric
Pieces 5 inches square or larger
Pieces 2 1/2 inch or wider by 15 inch or longer. (2 and 1/2 by 15 being the smallest size)

And batik fabric, any color, 6 1/2 inches square or larger.


The more we collect, the better variety. Something different is planned for 2019.





2018 Olathe Quilters' Guild Block of the Month

"I did it my way!" Creative Sampler



This sampler is geared for all levels of quilting- from beginner to advanced. This will be a 9 block sampler and you are allowed to make the blocks in any size and any color combination you desire. The committee has chosen these 9 blocks which were chosen to increase quilting techniques as the months progress. In early spring of 2019, voting will be held at a meeting (announced later this year) and prizes will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place viewer's choice.

The blocks to use are as follows

- 1. Nine Patch February
- 2. Rail Fence March
- 3. Four Patch April
- 4. Half Square Triangles -May
- 5. Quarter Square Triangles June
- 6. Flying Geese July
- 7. Square in a Square August
- 8. Log Cabin or Courthouse Step -September
- 9. Appliqued Heart October

Each member is allowed to alter or embellish each block, but keeping the basic "shape" of the block so it is recognized.

At the meetings, we will bring a display board of possible blocks that fit the requirement for the blocks listed above. During February's meeting, the board will show blocks for February, March, and April. Each following month will drop off the previous month's blocks and add the next following month's blocks.

Embellishments could include embroidery, applique, painting, thread painting, beading, or coloring, just to name a few.





To complete these quilts, the Committee discussed plans on having "Prep" sessions to cut batting, sew backings and then have full kits available for quilting. We even might have some actual Quilting sessions where, if you would like to practice simple quilting, we would have the quilts and experienced members that would be available to provide tips and tricks. Come for the practice and the fellowship. Stay tuned for dates.

Looking forward, we have begun checking on charities to consider as we continue in providing comfort to others. We plan on bringing our recommendations to the membership this spring for a vote. Your input and suggestions are welcomed!

As a reminder, the Charity Committee will ALWAYS accept any donation of fabric. We will work to stretch our funds resourcefully (to purchase batting and some backing fabric). If you want to donate your time, we will have more sewing sessions (outside of a meeting) in 2018. We will work to have 'quilt top kits' available that can be taken home to sew. Also, remember there will be no waste of fabric! From squares, to strips, to too-small-to use pieces that go towards doggie beds, everything is utilized.

Meeting Minutes
Olathe Quilter's Guild
January 9, 2018

The January, 2018, Guild meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. by President Mary Pacey. Mary welcomed every one, noting the attendance of some past members. She congratulated our Newsletter Editor, Sherri Critchfield, for a job well done on her first Guild newsletter. Mary introduced our featured quilter for January, Teresa Jones. Mary also stated that she intends to renew and retain past President Shari Pine's birthday treat activity at our meetings. Installation of 2018 officers for our Guild was conducted by Shari Pine.

A motion was requested to accept the December guild meeting minutes. The motion was made by Barb Dietz and seconded by Kenda Camp. The motion passed by acclamation.

After some brief discussion several motions were requested for approval of a variety of changes that were sent as attachments in the January newsletter:

A motion for By-Law revisions to be accepted was made by Peggy Anderson and seconded by Pam Pearson. The motion passed by acclamation.

A motion to accept new Workshop Policy Guidelines was made by Jolie Winer and seconded by Linda Ochs. The motion passed by acclamation.

A motion to accept he December Treasurer's report was made by Barb Dietz and seconded by Kenda Camp. The motion passed by acclamation.

Treasurer Libby Corriston conducted a review of the proposed 2018 budget including options for both a \$20 or \$30 membership dues amount. It was noted that the board had taken into consideration requests for increasing expenditures to include nationally known speakers due to our healthy treasury. Vice President Pam Pearson then discussed speakers that were being pursued for 2019 and into 2020 (as 2018 program speakers are already set).

Ballots were handed out to vote on whether to charge either \$20 or \$30 for annual membership dues. Ballots were collected and counted. The vote was 33 votes for \$30 dues and 17 votes for \$20 dues. The \$30 dues passed.

Other committee reports:

<u>Program</u> – Teresa Jones discussed our 2018 speakers line up. She explained the activity for the evening. Pam Pearson discussed and requested ideas for workshops.

<u>Ways & Means</u> - Linda Hagan stated that there were 3 raffle baskets available including one with a Valentine theme. She asked for a show of hands regarding interest in another Mystery Quilt fundraiser. More than 20 expressed interest. She will proceed to acquire another Mystery Quilt.

<u>Membership</u> –Jean Spohrer stated that membership cards for the evening's paid memberships will be available at the February meeting. Heather Buchwitz stated that there is a private Guild Facebook group that can be accessed through the Guild's Facebook page for members only.

<u>Charity</u> – Sherri Irving stated that additional charity quilt work will be done this year and encouraged everyone to sign up and/or donate materials and quilting.

Because there are so many changes and new committees, Mary Pacey will request approval votes for those committees at future meetings. She encouraged members to join a committee. Committees make the Guild really work and are a great way to meet new people.

Discussion was held on whether to continue the UFO Challenge activity. No motion was made. The UFO Challenge was discontinued.

The 2017 Mystery Quilts made by members were displayed and favorites were voted on by paper ballot. The Mystery Quilt favorites were: 1st – Heather Buchwitz, 2nd was a tie – Gretchen Ryan and Linda Ochs. Gift certificates were awarded.

"Getting to Know You" was the meeting's themed social activity. Handouts with information facts about members were used to ascertain which member matched which fact. 2 ½" squares of fabric were given when a match was made. The resulting collection of scrap squares were to be taken home and made into 10 ½" blocks for more charity quilts. Blocks are to be returned at the February meeting.

There were nine Show & Tell participants: Heather Buchwitz, Barb Dietz, Pam Pearson, Kerri Robinson, Teresa Jones, Janis Raspberry, Carolyn Routh, Shari Pine, and Janie Benander.

Pam Pearson was the winner of the evening's Door Prize. Raffle basket winners were Cheryl Wilcox, Kenda Camp and Janie Benander.

There were 45 members and 2 guests attending. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.




