2019 Workshops

January 29—Embroidery—Led by Arlene Banks

Grab a friend and come learn to embroider. It can be done while riding in the car, while waiting at children's practices, or at a game and (my favorite) while watching TV. In Beginning Embroidery you will learn the stem stitch, the back stitch, the daisy stitch, the blanket stitch and French knots.

I will explain how and why I use an interfacing, different ways to trace patterns and the types of pens used to trace.

Supplies to bring:

Embroidery Needle

1 skein of Embroidery thread (DMC, Cosmo or oth-

er)

Scissors

Pen and Paper

Optional: Hoop and Thimble

I will provide: Stitching material traced ready to embroider.

Olathe Quilters Guild General Meeting Minutes October 10, 2018

Note: October was our charity sew meeting and had begun with a number of members sewing as early as 1:00 p.m. through the afternoon and continued after the business meeting.

The October 2018, business meeting was called to order at 6:33 p.m. by Vice President Teresa Jones. She recognized our featured quilter, Sherri Irving, and announced there were no guests. Three members had October birthdays and were invited to receive a small gift from the Guild.

Teresa requested a motion to accept the September meeting minutes. Beverly Berberich made the motion. A second was made by Shelia Pierce. Teresa then requested approval of the Treasurer's report. A motion was made by Susan Gandy and seconded by Linda Hagen. Both motions passed, and the reports were accepted.

Ways & Means – Linda Hagen noted that the November meeting would include the UFO fundraising sale and auction and encouraged members to participate.

Welcome Table – there were 3 door prizes. Winners were Beverly Berberich, Carolyn Routh and Shelia Pierce.

Challenge – Shari Pine noted the location of the Bag Challenge entries and explained how the winning selection would work. She encouraged all to participate in the main challenge that is due at the November meeting.

President's Quilt – anyone who had not yet signed a block for the President's Quilt were invited to sign blocks that were available at the Welcome Table.

As stated earlier both the UFO auction and sale and the main Challenge would also be part of the November meeting. Shelia requested that her committee gather for a quick meeting after the general meeting tonight.

Teresa Jones noted that the December meeting program will be conducted by Lisa Hirsch to include a Hands-On activity. Members need to bring 15 each 5" x 5" or larger pieces of fabric to the meeting (you will take them back home after the meeting.)



Reminder: If the Olathe School District calls off school due to the weather, we will not have our guild meeting.




